A headline in the Palo Alto Times in 1978 read "Stanford Pyles" it on USF" after a particularly good day at the plate. After graduation from Stanford, John was pursued by The Los Angeles Dodgers organization before deciding to play professional baseball in Perth, Australia for 3 years. He loved baseball as well as the sun, beach, scuba diving and great friends he made Down Under. John returned to Oregon to play for the Salem Senators before sustaining a career-ending knee injury.

John's wide posse of friends came from his avid pursuit of golf at Portland, Astoria and De Anza Golf Clubs, steelhead fishing in the rivers of Oregon and British Columbia and bird hunting in South Dakota and on Sauvie Island. His athleticism, competitiveness and passion of sport were infused in these pastimes and he was forever grateful to his grandfather Goddard for teaching him to hunt and fish. John also loved the camaraderie of pubs, cards (especially pitch) and all forms of games. He enjoyed a friendly tease and was fond of providing his friends and family nicknames that often stuck.

John and his wife, Suzanne, shared a loving and robust life together and traveled if they weren't at their favorite spots in Borrego, Mercer lake, Gearhart and Portland. John was an active father and loved his Indian Princess times with this daughter Hannah or coaching sports with his son Jackson. As a husband, father or friend, John could always be counted on for listening, thoughtful advice, not taking himself too seriously and maybe a dash of humor added into the mix.

His beloved parents Jack and Diane Pyle preceded him in death and he is survived by his wife, Suzanne, daughter Hannah, son Jackson, sister Sally Kootnekoff (JC), brother Robert (Barry) nieces Molly (Kevin) and Emily (Zach), nephews Benjamin and David and many extended family, including nieces Laura and Meagan, nephews, Evan, Davey and Will and his good dog friend Smitty.
